Goals 4: Enhance Access to Local Data

MiPHY Outreach and Update– B.Hartl

Abstract: MiPHY helps paint the picture! The impact of obtaining and using local data is extremely IMPORTANT! MiPHY is an online student health survey offered by the Michigan Departments of Education and Health and Human Services to support local and regional needs assessment. The MiPHY provides student results on health risk behaviors including substance use, violence, physical activity, nutrition, sexual behavior, and emotional health in grades 7, 9, and 11. Data reported will help schools make data-driven decisions to improve prevention and health promotion programming.
