**ASSESSING the THREAT: VAPING! The new END thing** [Denise Herbert]

**Abstract:** Nationally Electronic Nicotine Devices (ENDS) have become an epidemic among youth. Youth use has soared to double digits over the past year. Twenty-five percent of high school students report vaping in the past 30 days. Youth report 1 in 5 have either vaped or have a friend that vapes.
