Red Ribbon Week began after the kidnapping, torture and murder of DEA agent Enrique "Kiki" Camarena in 1985. 2018 KCPC Project Sticker Shock: *Nadia Kimble*

Abstract: The KCPC 2018 Project Sticker Shock initiative is a community awareness program designed to prevent people 21 and older from purchasing alcohol and providing it to underage individuals. Participants involved in Project Sticker Shock visited partnering stores and placed stickers with a warning message about the penalties for providing alcohol to anyone under 21 and using a fake ID to purchase alcohol.
